My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

THE LEONE RESIDENCE FOR WOMEN

The Leone Residence has been helping young women between the ages of 12-18 years for the last 49 years. The Leone Residence provide a safe and nurturing residential environment for these young women who are still in the care of the Children's Aid Society. The home provides support and guidance to these young women who suffer from significant psychological, psychiatric and behavioural issues and who have experienced extreme conflict with their schools, families and community. The Residence's focus is to strengthen the young women in all areas of their lives in an attempt to transition them to foster home settings or independent living situations. The Leone Residence has a pasta fundraiser at the Riverside Sportsmen Club every Wednesday in the month of September from 5- 8 PM. This year St. Mark's has donated some of the school supplies and lunch bags to the Leona Residence. The Outreach Justice Team are looking forward to working closely with the Leone Residence.

WINDSOR RESIDENCE FOR YOUNG MEN

The Windsor Residence for Young Men have a program called KID NEXT DOOR. This program gives the homeless youth experience doing general maintenance work for residents in the community. This program is designed to provide the type of environment that most youth have when growing up in a more traditional family home. If you have home maintenance, flood and yard clean up, moving furniture, cleaning out eaves troughs, planting, weeding, painting, washing outdoor windows, please consider these youths to help you. The charge, minimum wage and the work is fully supervised by an adult. The supervision is free. If you are interested in giving these young men some work, or, if you are interested in volunteering please call Greg Goulin at 226-221-8464. The Windsor Residence for Young Men are having their 5th birthday party pasta dinner at the Caboto Club on October 4, 2017 from 4:30 to 7:30pm. Admission \$9.00 for adults, \$8.00 for seniors, \$6.00 for children 5-12 years old and \$10.00 for take-out. They will also be having a bake sale, draws and silent auction. Please consider attending and supporting the young men.

Please note that we **no longer** require milk bags or egg cartons.


To the end of August, we have one significant area of concern financially.

While costs are fairly consistent with prior years and current budget, offerings are unexpectedly down. Capital and regular offerings are \$9,000 less than a year ago at this time and more than \$14,000 lower than planned.

At vestry, we proposed and approved a slight increase in overall offerings to cover the increased costs that that we all experience year over year. Unfortunately, the increased offerings have not appeared and have actually gone down.

As a result, we are managing a much larger deficit than planned.

Please carefully consider your intended contributions and make appropriate changes.

Another way that parishioners can help and have done so in the past is by donating goods to these events. Every box of cookies that is purchase, every can of coffee (at present we have about 15 cans of coffee-thank you so much everyone), someone paying for the event ie: pancake supper (\$290), meat pies (\$200 per 8 batches of meat), or donating money to purchase items helps to lower the cost of the event will increases the profit. THANK YOU to all of you who over the last couple years made this a weekly or monthly mission to keep the cupboards filled for coffee hour and extra purchases for events. Rose also is in charge of the pantry in the kitchen so the more donations, the less shopping she needs to do.

Another thing that will be available this year is an Outline of "How to Run An Event".
